



## Case Study: Principal Designer CDM Advisor

### Background:

Dow Jones Architects was appointed to design the new Hans Rausing Lecture Theatre at the Science Museum in Kensington, London.

The project will be paid for by a donation from Tetra Pak billionaire Hans Kristian Rausing, and dedicated to his father, Hans Rausing KBE, in celebration of his 90th birthday.

### Brief:

The project involves the fit out of the museums existing lecture theatre. The works will entail the strip out of the existing space to enable a new fit out to include new floors and wall finishes, new lighting and emergency lighting, data, telecoms and power, new AV/ICT services, new security and access system and storage requirements. In addition, works will be undertaken to the foyer/entrance area to the lecture theatre: to relocate the suspended pendulum in the museum; the installation of a new suspended light dial below the pendulum; placement of new seating and the installation of specially commissioned art work.
